Dear St. Clare Families and Friends,

It is with great excitement that I write this letter of introduction as the new principal for St. Clare Catholic School. I have been dedicated to the field of education for nearly 20 years, which includes teaching STEM and gifted students in grades 5–8 at Holy Trinity Catholic School before later serving as Advancement Director



and Assistant Principal. Prior to that I spent three years as a middle school teacher at Whiteside School. I received my bachelor's degree in Elementary Education from Illinois State University, and I hold a master's degree in Administration and Leadership from McKendree University. My husband, David, and I have three sons who are products of Catholic school. We chose Catholic education for our children because we wanted a school community that inspired students to excel as leaders, encouraged critical thinking, and developed responsible citizens in a Catholic community.

When considering my next step in the Catholic school system, I wanted to be the principal at St. Clare because of its rich history, support from the O'Fallon community, and the dedication of the three parishes—St. Nicholas, St. Clare of Assisi, and Corpus Christi.

This is an exciting time to be part of St. Clare! The halls are filled with the energy of teachers who are passionate about education and focused on what makes Catholic schools great: a curriculum infused with our faith, strong traditions, discipline, and academic excellence. Additionally, St. Clare is blessed with dedicated school families who partner with us in this process of education and faith formation for all students.

Faith Formation: All-school Masses have resumed this year! We love to see students serving, cantoring, and reading at weekly and all-school Masses. It feels good to also be using the St. Clare Chapel again. It is not only a place to attend Mass but also a classroom where teachers can give lessons on parts of the Mass, the meaning behind different parts of the Chapel, and the importance of being reverent. We are fortunate to have such a wonderful space for students to use daily.

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Curriculum: Teachers are working with Mrs. Christina Howard, Assistant Principal, to ensure their curriculum aligns to standards. Consistent and intentional professional development for teachers enhances our curriculum and creates a culture where teachers are confident in their skill sets. We are excited that two of our teachers recently attended an intense 40-hour training on Orton Gillingham, a multisensory approach for a more effective literacy program. This is a highly structured teaching method that introduces the idea of breaking reading and spelling down into smaller skills involving letters and sounds, then building on these skills over time. We believe this approach will benefit all younger students, and ultimately all K–3 teachers will be trained on Orton Gillingham in order to achieve consistency in our elementary ELA instruction.

Technology: Our new Makerbot 3-D Printers have arrived, and we have added how-to lessons to the technology curriculum for 7th and 8th grade students. After completing online courses on how to use the 3-D printers, our junior high students will receive Makerbot Certification status. 3-D printing allows students to foster creativity, communicate, collaborate as a team, and create digital designs that translate into objects. These are all skills that will serve them well as they move forward in their education.

Specials: K–5 students participate in Art, Spanish, PE, Band, Drama, Technology, and Music, and students in grades 6–8 participate in Art, Technology, Music, PE, Drama, and Band. We are fortunate to be able to offer these additional options to ensure students have the opportunity to explore their passions and creativity while also beginning to develop cultural competence and appreciation.

Everyone who has helped build this St. Clare School community over the past 150-plus years has left an enduring legacy. I am honored to continue their mission, and I am dedicated to making St. Clare the best it can possibly be for all of our students. I value the support of our priests, parishioners, families, alumni, and community in this exciting endeavor.

Empower Illinois Scholarships

St. Clare Catholic School has been incredibly blessed by our Empower Illinois scholarship donors. This year we had 12 donors, along with a generous individual who created a 1-to-1 matching gift program that doubled our donations (up to \$15,000). For the 2021–2022 school year, we awarded 20 scholarships to our students for a total of \$60,748.30!

Empower Illinois is a 501(c)(3) organization that advocates for innovation in Illinois education and provides private school scholarships to low-income and working-class families. These scholarships are part of the Invest in Kids Scholarship Tax Credit Program, which was authorized in 2017 under the Invest in Kids Act.



The State of Illinois had intended to let the Invest in Kids Scholarship Tax Credit Program expire in 2020. This past spring, Christina Howard, assistant principal, Clarice McKay, former principal, and Eileen Yahl, bookkeeper, lobbied to keep this important program intact by traveling to the Illinois State Capitol. They spent an entire day speaking

to legislators and making phone calls alongside many other Illinois educators. A week later, Illinois legislators reached a bipartisan agreement, extending the program for an additional year.

If you, or someone you know, would like to help children from low-income families receive a Catholic school education, now is the time! The Empower Illinois Scholarship Program offers a 75 percent income tax credit to individuals and businesses that contribute to St. Clare Catholic School under the Invest in Kids Act.
